### **DISCUSSION:**

- The honorarium has never been increased.
- The proposed mileage would be provided monthly regardless of the kilometres the elder drives each month. Based on attendance.
- Not all members attend consistently.
- Elders only receive the honorarium when they attend meetings or school visits.
- Increase of \$100 to the honorarium minimizes discrepancies and accommodates increase in cost of living.
- Direction to inform the Chief of the respective Nation of the members that are not attending regularly.

Adjustment to Circle of Elders honorarium. Motion 2025-26/2025-05-13/215. Moved by Azure Johnson, seconded by Allison Adams-Bull, John Nepoose and Helen Bull abstained, 6 Board Governors in favour, motion carried.
