MESC is dedicated to its vision of promoting confident, competent, and resilient Cree-speaking students. To do this, we recognize that all of our children are unique and special. Therefore, the information outlined below are guidelines that reflect MESC's process for the final June report card but are flexible based on individual student circumstances.

For students who engaged in the learning packages and online learning who were on track to pass as of March 15, the final grade may be higher than the student's grade as of March 15; however, it should not be lower than the student's grade as of March 15.

For students who were on track to pass as of March 15, the final grade will remain equivalent to their standing as of March 15.

For students who were not on track to pass as of March 15, all opportunities, such as Credit Recovery, will be presented to get them on track. After consultation with the student, parent/guardian(s), a final grade of withdrawal (WDR) may be assigned.

MESC recognizes that students are in unique circumstances that can present a challenging learning environment. Teachers and principals are committed to taking individual circumstances into consideration and responding in an appropriate manner that best serves the student.
